STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES

Equine Canada, the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction.

Equine Canada is committed to:

- •Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- •Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- •Ensuring that owners, trainers and exhibitors or their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care
 professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standard of nutrition, health, comfort,
 sanitation, and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- •Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- •Increasing education in training and horsemanship practices;
- •Requiring owners, trainer, and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulation in all equestrian competitions;
- Reviewing, revising, and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of horses.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

THE RULE BOOK

Exhibitors, Judges, and Show Officials, are responsible for a knowledge of the rules specified in the RULES OF **EQUINE CANADA**. Full details of Horse Show Operation, Equine Canada (including F.E.I.) Rules and other vital information or in the Rule Book of exclusive use of National Shows. Adult Amateur, Junior, and Open Equine Canada Competitions (must have purchased a competitive license) each receive a copy of the Rule Book and are eligible to count points won at National Equine Canada competitions for annual awards.

GENERAL RULES AND CONDITIONS FOR EQUINE CANADA COMPETITION

- Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of Equine Canada and will be held and judged in accordance with said rule book.
- Entries must have a 2013 Equine Canada Competitive License. Riders competing in the bronze show must have a BRONZE or higher competitive license. Those competing in the GOLD show must have a GOLD level license.
- 3. Horse Passports are mandatory for GOLD competitors. They are to be presented to the show secretary upon arrival at the show. All horses must either have a valid passport and an annual horse license (sticker for 2013 attached to the passport) or buy a Temporary Horse Registration. Annual horse license stickers are available from Equine Canada Phone (613) 248-3433 Ext 112). The cost of an annual horse license is \$12.
- 4. Drug testing fees will be collected and drug testing may take place for the bronze and/or gold show.
- All entries must have a Saskatchewan Horse Federation (SHF) membership or membership from another provincial sport governing body. All entry fees must be paid by cash or cheque - payable to Regina District Dressage Association (RDDA)
- 6. Numbers must be worn, and be visible, at all times outside of the stall.
- 7. Cancellations: Competitors canceling after the official closing date will be refunded entry fees minus administration fee of \$35 upon the receipt of a vet certificate of disability or a doctor's certificate. Competitors canceling after 5pm August 13 will receive no refund.
- 8. The show committee reserves the right to make changes to the show schedule. Classes may be canceled, split or combined due to lack of sufficient entries. The show committee also reserves the right to limit entries or make any necessary changes to the prize list or program. Competitors will be notified as early as possible. The onus is on the competitor to familiarize herself/himself with such changes.
- As per article E 7.10.4 all athletes, regardless of age or level of competition must wear ASTM/SEI or BSI/BS EN
 Approved protective headgear at all times when mounted at any EC-sanctioned Dressage competition at the
 event location.
- 10. Cross Entering: Horses may be ridden by more than one rider at a competition, but not more than once in a category, i.e., A horse may enter with a junior in the Junior and/or Open Category at one level. The same horse with a senior rider may enter in Adult Amateur/Open Category in the next consecutive level. (EC Dressage Rule 7.11.8)
- A rider may approach the steward prior to each test to ensure that dress and equipment are in accordance with the rules. IT IS THE ULTIMATE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE COMPETITOR TO ENSURE THAT HE/SHE COMPLIES WITH THE RULES. It is the responsibility of the rider to report directly to the steward after completion of each test.
- 12. In the designated warm up arena, running martingales are permitted to be used on snaffle reins of the bridle. Single direct side reins (when lunging an unmounted horse with one lunge line) are permitted. Boots and bandages may be worn anywhere except in the competition arena. Martingales (other than running), bit guards, any kind of gadget such as bearing, running, or balancing reins, ear plugs, under penalty of elimination are STRICTLY FORBIDDEN ON THE SHOW GROUNDS AT ANY TIME DURING THE COMPETITION.
- 13. No horse may compete in more than two consecutive levels. No horse may be ridden in more than four tests, including the freestyle, in one day. (EC Dressage Rule 7.11.9)

- 14. In order to enter a freestyle at a GOLD Competition, the horse/rider combination must have obtained a minimum score of 55% at the same technical level as the freestyle they wish to enter. E10.6.1
- 15. If music is on a CD, the rider should also have a second back up copy. Please have these well labeled.
- Scorings and Placings: All scores in dressage tests will now be calculated to the third decimal. Any horse receiving less than 40% in a test will be eliminated. Any horse receiving less than 50% in a test will not be eligible for ribbons, prizes, etc. When only one horse in a class, ribbons will be awarded with the following percentages:

First 60% or higher Second 57% to 59.9% Third 54% to 56.9% Fourth 51% to 53.9%

17. It is a condition of entry that neither Regina District Dressage Association, nor the show committee will be held responsible in any way for damage, injury or loss to persons, horses, or property of spectators or competitors.

Saskatchewan Provincials & Bronze Show Apply to the BRONZE show and the GOLD shows

- 1. No phone entries will be accepted. Entries must be postmarked by August 13th 2013 and sent to the show secretary. Scanned Email entries may be sent to ravenwood652@gmail.com it is your prerogative to check with the secretary that they have been received. All required paper work must be sent with entries- ie memberships 2. Stabling is available for a fee of \$60 for the weekend.
 - Shavings only in the stalls- shavings are not provided
 - Haul in rides are allowed. A \$15 fee/day is required. Please keep horse supervised at all times
 - Stall must be stripped prior to departure, include separate \$25 cheque for stall cleaning, that will be returned when stall is stripped at end of show
- 3. The gate will not be closed for any dressage tests in the bronze show or Saturday's Gold show
- 4. Dogs are not allowed on the show grounds.
- 5. Copies of the tests are available at www.equinecanada.ca If you are unable to access this website, please contact the show secretary for copies of the tests.
- 6. Provincials are held on Sunday. Qualifying scores at the level entered must be submitted. If the show fills by closing date entries will be chosen from top qualifying scores down. Qualifying scores must be from Gold Level shows in 2013

Please note these are two separate shows (1 bronze 1 gold) being run at the same time each day. There is a total of three shows being held through the weekend 1 two day Bronze show and 2 one day Gold shows.

Separate entry forms are included for the BRONZE and GOLD shows and if wanting to show in both levels of shows both entry forms must be filled out and fees paid.

The shows Saturday and Sunday (Bronze and gold) are separate shows. One entry form office fee only needs to be paid once (bronze or gold) for the weekend.

Championships will not be awarded in the BRONZE show. Provincial Championships will be awarded for the Sunday GOLD show using Sunday's scores

Show will be run outside weather permitting. Please note the indoor ring will be used in bad weather/unsafe footing. This ring is smaller and freestyles will be cancelled if the show moves indoors.

Rules/Regulations:

- 1. Half hour time blocks may be purchased for \$30. Payment must be attached with the warm up request form. Cheques made payable to RDDA.
- 2. Time slots can be purchased by a single rider, or by a group of riders. All horse/riders must be registered with the competition to be eligible for a warm-up time.
- 3. RDDA will not be responsible for grouping people together to share the ring.
- 4. Each horse/rider combination is only allowed to book 1 half hour time slot. A rider can book more than 1 half hour time slot if riding a different horse in each time slot.
- 5. All warm-up requests will be scheduled on a first come, first serve basis.
- 6. All riders must be a member of the SHF.
- 7. Riders will be notified of warm up schedule on Monday August 19th by 10pm via email
- 8. Professional etiquette must be maintained by all competitors and coaches.
- 9. No riders will be allowed to ride in or around the dressage ring during the warm-up time without purchasing a warm-up block of time.
- 10. Other warm up arenas will be available for use.
